Rolling hills, dense woodlands, and isolated beaches cover Cat Island’s 150 square miles, with the ability to fulfill a traveler’s every desire. And beyond the natural beauty, hints of early cultures mingle among the small inns and guest houses. For those who want a sense of true African-Bahamian culture, Cat Island is the perfect vacation destination for private pilots. It is believed the earliest residents were the peaceful Arawaks and they were the first to welcome Columbus to the New World. You can still explore the remains of slave huts dating back to the 1700s, Arawak Indian caves and climb to the Hermitage monastery on Mt. Alvernia – the Bahamas highest peak at 207 feet. Cat Islanders are known for their ingenuity at using the materials at hand to make whatever they need. Much of The Bahamas’ Rake N’ Scrape indigenous music, folklore and myth originated here.
